IN-HOUSE GROUND RULES

I. PARTICIPANTS

The Participants for the event shall be students in the secondary private and public schools. Participants should pass the athletes eligibility based on NSAC Guidelines of DepEd.

II. REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS

- A. Players shall register before the event proper with proper documentation as to confirm the player's identity to the National Screening Accreditation Committee.
- B. Players must present their "**DELEGATION ID**" to the Tournament Manager for verification purposes at the start of each match.

III. PLAYER REQUIREMENTS

- A. Each player shall be required to bring AT LEAST ONE OF the following equipment during the event, lending or borrowing of such equipment is strictly prohibited;
 1. Break Cue
 2. Cue Stick
- B. Each player is allowed to bring the following optional equipment found herein below. Lending of equipment during a match is prohibited. However, if the cue tip is accidentally broken or detached he/she is allowed to borrow from his/her teammate; and in the same manner when the whole cue stick is damaged.
 1. Jump Cue
 2. Chalk/Gloves
 3. Tapper
- C. Player Dress Code

Boys

- Delegation Uniform/Collared Polo (*in the absence of delegation uniform*)
- Pants
- Black Shoes with rubber soles

Girls

- Delegation Uniform /Close Collared Polo (*in the absence of delegation uniform*)
- Pants
- Black Shoes with rubber soles

Note: Wearing of unprescribed uniform during the official match is prohibited and this also includes the use of gadgets which.

D. No bringing of gadgets during the match.

IV. MODE OF THE COMPETITION

Disciplines that will be played during the Palarong Pambansa would be **9-ball & 8-ball singles**. Single elimination or knock-out system is being applied. The match will be race to five (5) from the elimination round until the semi-final round, and race to seven (7) for the championship round. The champion for **Group A** will play against the champion of **Group B** to determine the gold and silver medalists, respectively. The loser of **Group A** will play against the loser of **Group B** to determine the bronze medalist in a race to five (5). The Palarong Pambansa Technical Committee reserves the right to increase the number of race depending on the number of participating regions. Furthermore, the following are the mode of play, to wit;

- The players will be grouped into two (2): Group A and Group B;
- Each team will be given an **OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM** to determine player's group assignments in both events;
- Drawing of lots (1-17) shall be done for both Groups A and B.
- A *single elimination or knock-out system* shall be applied in the competition. Refer to the diagram format below;














B. The particular ruling set by the Palarong Pambansa technical committee 2018 will be followed. The following to wit:

1. All participants and coaches are expected to strictly follow the BSCP code of conduct.
2. Each player is allowed to take one time out of five minutes during his turn or inning only after the third (3) rack for both 8-Ball and 9-Ball events. To exercise his right for a time out, the player must:
 - (1) *inform the referee of his intention; (for special cases such as personal necessity, this should fall under referee's time out. As to the number of minutes, it's the referee's discretion if he thinks deemed necessary;)*
 - (2) *make sure the referee is aware of the fact and marks it on the score sheet, and;*
 - (3) *make sure that the referee marks the table for suspended play. (The standard procedure will be to place a cue stick on the table.)*
3. **COACHES** and **AUDIENCES** are not allowed to interrupt any on-going match. The technical committee reserves the right to preserve every participant's focus and the right to eject audiences and coaches who interferes with the match. In cases of protests, the coach must be responsible enough to follow protest guidelines.
4. If a player unscrews his/her cue stick while the opponent takes turn to run the table, it will be considered a concession of the match. The player automatically **LOSS the GAME**.
5. Winners' break in both 8-ball and 9-ball events.
6. For **slow play**, it is under the technical official's discretion to apply the 40-second shot clock and a 40-second extension. Each player is given two extensions only. If such a decision is made, the technical official will inform the players.
7. **NO PENALTY** will be imposed for failure to meet the three (3) point break rule, however, the incoming player will still have the option (*please refer to the guide book*).
8. A twenty-minute defaulting time should be observed. Time starts after the first call is made.
9. The race to five (5) starting from 1st elimination round until bronze medal match and the race to seven (7) for championship game will be observed.
